Dear Residents, Families, and Caregivers,

I hope this finds you well and in good health. As the COVID-19 pandemic has slowed, we are looking forward to reopening. However, there is quite a bit of work ahead of us before we can relax the current restrictions in place and open our doors to visitation. As we have transitioned into the “Green Phase” designation, we wanted to give you an update on our initiatives and facility happenings.

Centers of Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) requires the data below to be provided weekly to the National Healthcare Safety Network (NHSN).

Resident Impact (May 8, 2020 thru July 16, 2020)

Number of cases	
0	ADMISSIONS: Residents admitted or readmitted who were previously hospitalized and treated for COVID-19
0	CONFIRMED: Residents with new laboratory positive COVID-19
0	SUSPECTED: Residents with new suspected COVID-19
0	TOTAL DEATHS: Residents who died in the facility or another location
0	COVID-19 DEATHS: Residents with suspected or laboratory positive COVID-19 who died in the facility or another location.

Under the “Green Phase” designation senior living providers are still under the same visitation restrictions and modified community operations as we previously outlined. There are a number of factors that come into play for us to move past these restrictions and return to inside visitation and normalized operations.

The major cornerstone to allowing us to reopen is universal, baseline testing of residents and staff. New guidance, issued just this week, requires providers to test residents and staff for COVID -19 prior to July 24th. We completed the testing, well in advance of the July 24th deadline. All of our resident and current associates baseline testing was negative.

Once a County has moved into the “Green Phase,” a minimum of 28 days must pass from entering this phase and also assume the following conditions are met:

- No active or new Covid-19 cases within the last 28 days
- The facility is not experiencing staff shortages
- The facility has adequate supplies of personal protective equipment and essential cleaning and disinfection supplies to care for residents
- The facility has adequate access to testing for COVID-19
- Referral hospital(s) have bed capacity on wards and intensive care units

At the current time, new admissions are being tested prior to transfer into the facility. New staff is being tested prior to starting.

A large part of our strategic preparation is staffing contingency plans and breaking the facility into different zones for positive, presumed positive or exposed, and negative results. Follow up testing procedures will be based on the initial testing outcome.

We continue to report our data to a number of sources on a daily and weekly basis. This data is now publically published by the Pennsylvania Department of Health on a routine basis.

In closing, I hope all of you and your families are well and healthy. We will get through these challenging times together and be stronger in the end!
